The classification of Cultural Heritage according to UNESCO






We will describe each category:

Tangible cultural heritage:

- Movable cultural heritage (paintings, sculptures, coins, manuscripts)
- Immovable cultural heritage (monuments, archaeological sites, and so on)
- Underwater cultural heritage (shipwrecks, underwater ruins and cities)





Intangible cultural heritage: oral traditions, performing arts and rituals. Module I. Culture & IP



Natural heritage: natural sites with cultural aspects such as cultural landscapes, physical, biological or geological formations.
