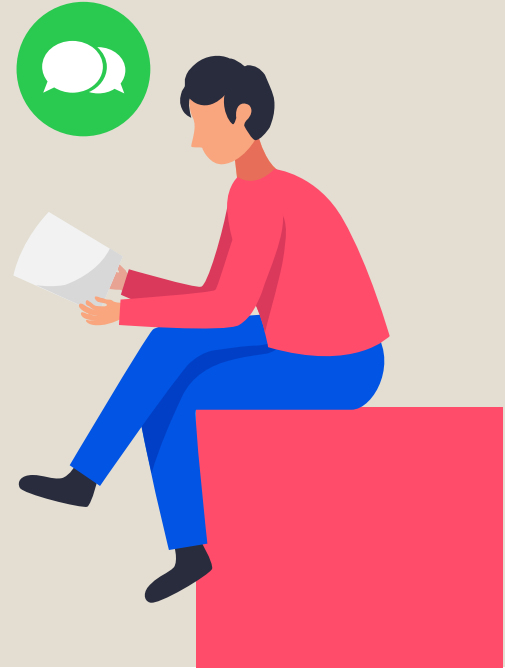
The steps to make
Creative Commons
licenses





Before going into the steps to create licenses, let's remember once again why we are using Creative Commons...

Because their licenses assure the users of the works the possibilities of using these works, while allowing a final control of the copyright for the original owner.





Now without further ado, let's walk through each of the steps to create CC licenses.

Step 1: Enter Creative Commons website:

Step 2: Choose your license features: adaptation on your work and commercial uses. As shown in the image.

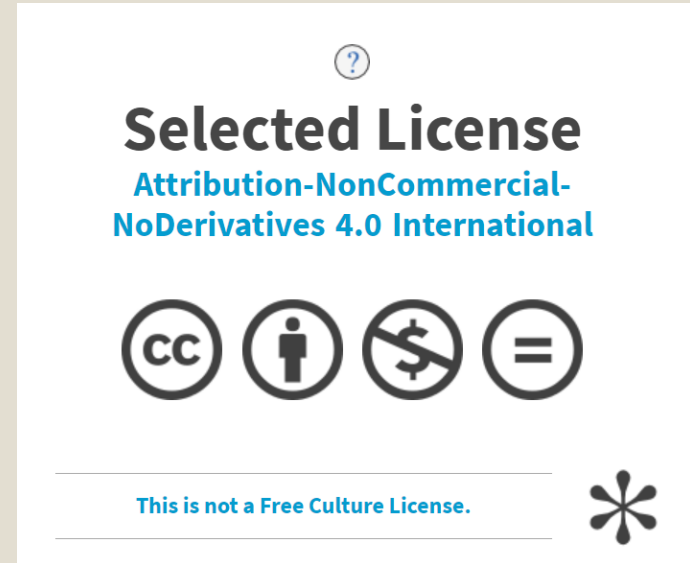
