



Comics are a language where images and text meet in a unique form of communication, capable of telling any kind of story.








What you see and what you imagine











The reader obeys the laws of "Visual Perception"





The reader intervenes by filling in the "white space", i.e. the white line separating one vignette from another











A leap sometimes between two moments very close in time and space, sometimes miles or years apart.



















A comic strip is made up of the association of several images and therefore a panel alone is not enough, just as a word alone does not make a novel.












According to Will Eisner, these are framed images that follow the same logic as the reading order of the written word.







If we arrange the words in a random order on a sheet of paper, the beholder The most incredible phrases will come out.







When we arrange them in a row on a horizontal axis then the sentence exists.


