Our brain collects all the information available at first glance and then analyzes it to make a judgment about the people we meet.



We especially look at the face, our brain knows that facial clues are the most significant.



Afterwards, our brain categorizes the information and then makes quick comparisons where our experiences and perceptions influence

TAKE CARE OF YOUR WAY OF DRESSING


and do it according to the context in which you are

he one we use in the workplace is more formal than the colloquial environment used in the context of friends.





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
2. HOW TO MAKE A GOOD FIRST IMPRESSION?
