

Activity

- **Short Description**: In this activity, students will create a SWOT matrix for a selected cultural or natural asset, to see the strengths and opportunities that can be obtained from weaknesses or threats. In this way, it will be easier to organize the information that should be included in the script.
- Methodology: Collaborative learning.
- **Duration:** 2 hours
- Difficulty (high medium low): Medium
- Individual / Team: Individual, but group discussion.
- Classroom / House: House, but classroom discussion.
- What do we need to do this activity?
 - Hardware: Laptop
 - **Software:** Web browser
 - Other resources: Paper and pen

• **Text description:** This activity aims to search for information about the heritage asset on the internet to discover what to tell and how to tell it.

Instructions

- 1. Choosing a heritage item
- 2. Search for information on the internet about the cultural or natural asset
- 3. Identify if this information represents advantages or disadvantages to communicate the values of the heritage
- 4. Dump that information in the matrix to be able to later write the script

- Write a first draft version of the descriptive script of the heritage element
