## Activity

- **Short Description:** In this activity we will make a decision about using photo-video concept or video concept multimedia to disseminate the values detected in the heritage element.
- **Methodology:** Research-based learning
- **Duration:** 1 hour
- **Difficulty (high - medium - low):** Low
- **Individual / Team:** Individual
- **Classroom / House:** House
- **What do we need to do this activity?**
  - **Hardware:** Computer
  - **Software:** Web browser
  - **Other resources:** Pen and paper

## Description

- **Text description:** This activity consists of selecting a heritage element, characterizing it, evaluating its values, and choosing the type of multimedia content that best suits its dissemination.



## Instructions

1. Choose a heritage asset.
2. Analyze the relevant information and characterize it (see Annex I).
3. Evaluate the type of audiovisual content that best shows these outstanding characteristics: photo-video concept or video concept.
4. Justify the choice.

## Expected outcomes

- Understand the benefits of each of the two multimedia contents: photo or video.
- Associate each of these multimedia content with pre-established heritage characteristics.

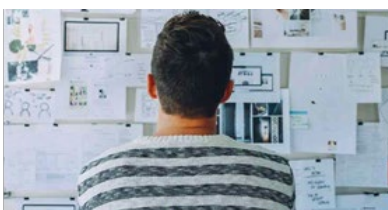

## Example:

- **Chosen heritage:** sculpture “La Virgen de Quito”



- **Relevant information:** The Virgin of Quito is a monument of the capital city, in Ecuador. It is located on the top of the El Panecillo hill, a peculiar elevation in the shape of a small bread that is located in the heart of the city. The monument inaugurated in 1975 is 41 meters high, if the base is added and it is the tallest statue in Ecuador and one of the tallest in South America, surpassing even the famous Christ the Redeemer in the city of Rio de Janeiro. It is also the tallest aluminum sculpture on the planet. The monument is a replica of the work of Bernardo de Legarda made (Quiteña School) in 1732 delivered for one of the altarpieces of the side chapels of the Church of San Francisco, located in the historic center of Quito named Cultural Heritage of Humanity. The 7,400 aluminum pieces were designed and built by the Spanish Agustín de la Herrán Matorras, and the base was built from concrete with a volcanic stone cladding.
- **Charaterization:** Inmovable cultural heritage
- **Video or photo:** photo because it is a fixed sculpture and we want to disseminate its characteristics, which are static.



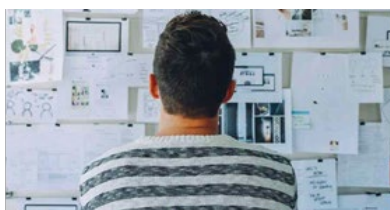
