
Now without further ado, let's walk through each of the steps to create CC licenses.


Step 2: Choose your license features: adaptation on your work and commercial uses. As shown in the image.



License chosen:

Based on the prior selection, not allowing any adaption to our product or any commercial use, this is the license we have selected:

Important: The website automatically creates the license based on the answers we provide regarding adaption and commercial use.



Step 3: This step is optional; it helps users to attribute the author

The person who is creating the license should fill the form linked in the image

Help others attribute you!

This part is optional, but filling it out will add machine-readable metadata to the suggested HTML!

Final step: Copy the code in the O-City platform. Remember, you can also choose the size of the license icon!
